

ECKHART PARK TRAIL

1500 S. CEDAR STREET

Eckhart Trail is a paved trail that winds through Auburn's Oldest Park. Large trees, open space Eckhart Park is also home to a 9-hole Disc Golf Course.

Trail Length: 0.36 Mile Loop

Trail Features: Eckhart Park includes playgrounds, swing sets, and pavilions. As well as wooden swings and picnic tables. Enjoy the view of Cedar Creek!

Parking: Parking is available in the Eckhart Park parking lot, adjacent to the Parks Department Office.



RIEKE PARK TRAIL

The Rieke Park Trail has entrances located on North VanBuren Ave, North Street, Betz Road as well as Rieke Park. The Rieke Park Trail offers a paved surface which lies in the footprint of a historic railroad. The trail is intended for use by both foot traffic and bicycle traffic.

Trail Length: 1.15 Miles

Trail Features: Rieke Trail is equipped with dog stations at all entrances, strategically placed benches, and an informational board to keep you up to date on what is going on with the Auburn Parks.

Parking: Parking is available near the North Street Entrance as well as the Rieke Park Entrance.

Rieke Trail also has access along Betz Road to the Waterloo Trail system. This trail runs .5 mile south to Morning Star Road, and 2.3 miles to the north, passing DeKalb High School and the Classic City Center.

PUFFERBELLY TRAIL

BEGINS AT ACD MUSEUM ENDS AT NORTH STREET AND VAN BUREN

The Pufferbelly Trail is Auburn's newest trail. This paved trail is 6 feet wide making it easy to distinguish from normal sidewalks in town.

Trail Length: 1.2 Miles

Trail Features: Trail allows access to the Auburn Cord Deussenberg Museum, downtown Auburn, Riley Park, and connects to the Rieke Trail along North Street.

Parking: Parking is available on South Van Buren Street across from the ACD Museum.

DON LASH TRAIL

2005 PORTAGE PASS

Located in the woods of Don Lash Park, this trail guides hikers along a mulch path, and through an ecosystem that includes large trees, swamps and natural birding areas.

Trail Length: 0.29 Mile Loop

Trail Features: The Don Lash Trail winds through a wooded area that includes a wooden walk path to ensure that your feet stay dry when traveling over the marsh landscape. There are also wooden benches along the trail.

Parking: Parking is available near the entrance of Don Lash Park along Portage Pass.



HAGUE NATURE TRAIL

1500 S. CEDAR STREET

The Hague Nature Trail runs from Eckhart Park, East to Center Street. The Hague is a wooded path with a mulch surface that allows visitors to identify trees and wildlife in their natural habitats.

Trail Length: 0.25 Mile

Trail Features: Hague allows citizens along center street access to Eckhart Park, which includes; playgrounds, swing sets, pavilions and the Eckhart Park walking path.

Parking: Parking is available in the Eckhart Park parking lot, adjacent to the Parks Department Main Office.
